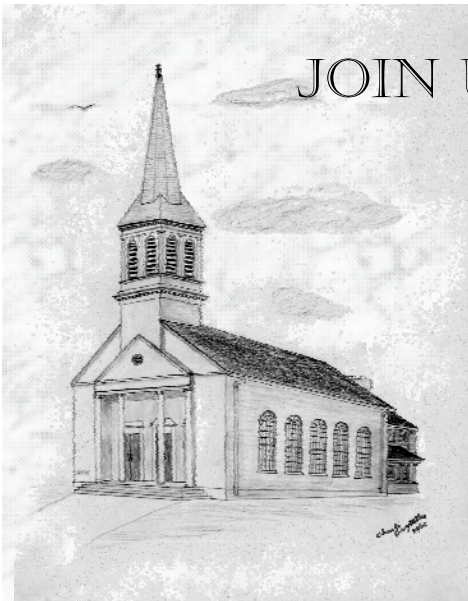

Billy Graham once estimated that the average believer has twenty-five encounters with Christians before choosing to accept God's gift of grace.
